



Bodies of Water

Rhime River

- The Rhine River starts in Switzerland in the Alps mountain range.
- It flows northwest through Germany, France, Luxembourg, and the Netherlands.
- It's the longest river in Germany.
- The Rhine is an important waterway for shipping industries, as well as a major water source for farms and factories.







Damube River

- The Danube River begins in Germany and flows east across 10 countries for a total of 1,770 miles.
- It is the 2nd largest river in Europe. (The Volga River is first.)
- It has played a vital role in the development of central Europe in terms of trade and cultural diffusion.




Biking Along the Danube

Volga River

- The Volga River is the longest river in Europe.
- It is about 2,300 miles long.
- The river flows through central Russia and into the Caspian Sea
- It is widely regarded as the national river of Russia

The Volga River




M The longest river in Europe --> 2,300 miles.



English Chammel

- The English Channel is a narrow body of water that separates the United Kingdom from the European mainland (specifically, from France).
- It is 350 miles long.
- The English Channel was and still is an important waterway for trade.











The Chumel

- The Chunnel is a tunnel that runs underneath the English Channel and connects Britain to France.
- The Chunnel, an underground railway, was opened under the channel in 1994.
- At its lowest point, it is 250 feet deep
- At 23.5 miles long, the tunnel has the longest undersea portion of any in the world.





Mediterrameam Sea

- The Mediterranean Sea is the crossroads for 3 continents: Europe, Africa, and Asia.
 - The name means "in the middle of the earth" (it's surrounded by land).
- It surrounds Italy and has a dry, warm climate.
- This sea covers an area of 965,000 square miles and is the world's largest inland sea.
- It has been an important center for trade and cultural exchange for thousands of years.








Atlantic Ocean

- The Atlantic Ocean is the second largest of the world's oceans.
- It covers approximately 20 percent of the Earth's surface and about 29 percent of its water surface area.
- It separates the "Old World" from the "New World".
- It is located in between the Americas and Europe/Africa.





North Sea

- The North Sea has provided waterway access for commerce and conquest.
- Many areas have access to the North Sea because of its long coastline and the European rivers that empty into it.






Land Features

The Alps

• The Alps are a mountain range located in Austria, France, Germany, Switzerland, Italy, Slovenia, and Liechtenstein.

• They extend for almost 700 miles!

• The Alps are a major tourist destination.

Pyremees Mountains

• The Pyrenees are a mountain range that form the natural border between France and Spain.

• They extend for roughly 270 miles.





Vral Mountains

- The Ural Mountains are considered to be the natural boundary between Europe and Asia.
 - They actually divide Russia between the continents: 1/4 of Russia is in Europe and 3/4 of the country is in Asia.
- They extend for almost 1,500 miles!
- The Ural Mountains are among the world's oldest mountain ranges.
- They have huge deposits of gold, nickel, silver, platinum, coal, iron, and other minerals.







Iberiam Pemimsula

• The Iberian Peninsula includes the countries of Spain and Portugal.

• The Pyrenees Mountains form the northern border and separate the Iberian Peninsula from the rest of Europe.





European Plain

- The European Plain stretches from the Atlantic in the west to the Ural Mountains in the east.
 - It extends for 2,000 miles.
- It is the largest mountain-free landform in Europe.
- The European Plain contains rich farmland and is a successful agricultural area.
